# Right to Information Roadshow

Would you like more information on your right to access government information?

The Office of the Information Commissioner is running a Right to Information Roadshow across New South Wales to help people learn about new ways to access information from government agencies.

New rights to government information came into force on 1 July 2010. This means state government agencies, local councils, state-owned corporations and Ministers and their staff now have to work differently to provide easier access to more information than ever before.

## free information sessions

The Right to Information Roadshow will visit 11 regional centres. At each location, a free information session for the public and community organisations will explain how to access government information under the new system and outline the OIC's role in assisting government agencies, monitoring compliance with the new law and investigating complaints. An information session for government agencies will provide education, advice and assistance on how government staff can comply with the new legislation.
